Through demonstrations and hands-on sessions, you will gain an understanding of hair growth and client consultation, as you learn all aspects of waxing, including preparing for a waxing treatment, performing waxing treatments, and after-wax treatment and advice.

What will I Learn?

- hair growth
- client consultation
- identifying client requirements, including growth requiring special treatment
- selecting procedures and products for the client
- preparing the service area and client
- workplace policies and procedures
- preparing and cleaning for the waxing treatment
- removing unwanted hair with hot and strip wax
- maintaining recommended wax according to manufacturer instructions
- applying soothing after-wax product
- obtaining and recording client feedback
- identifying and explaining associated contraindications and adverse effects of waxing
- recommending future treatment
- revising treatment plans
- providing home-care advice and making product recommendations.
